


AmbiFi supports styling at many levels, organization, activity, list, section and item.

In this activity we will show how to use Markdown to provide some inline styling and how to utilize styles


There are two ways to enter rich text in AmbiFi. One is with the WYSIWYG rich text editor. Another is with an industry standard called Markdown, which is a way to enter rich text with standard characters.

Markdown is a simple text based way to allow for inline styling.

On this first slide we will look at how to make text bold, just surround it with double asterisk (\*\*).




The second example shows italic text. Just surround the text with single underlines (\_).




To build a bulleted list make sure to start a new line and use the asterisk (\*) characters as bullets, this will then output a nice bulleted list.

A blank line is needed before the first bullet to separate the list from the previous content.



You can also use CSS type styling for labels, in this training activity we will only address how to apply styles to items directly.



This is what the output is going to look like in the preview.

Styles can be applied to items directly or sections, list, the activity or even the organization.
